Outstanding Youth Selection Procedure

- I. This procedure is established for the selection of candidates for recognition as outstanding youth, who can serve as a model for other student, from this university.
- II. This procedure will be administered by the Student Assistance Division of the Office of Student Affairs.
- III. All currently enrolled students of this university who study at this school for a year, application for the school students under 40 years old, and have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) 2.44 or above and a cumulative behavior grade point average (conduct) A or above are eligible for selection if they meet one of the following requirements. (Those who are once elect are not eligible.)
 - (1) Concrete demonstration of outstanding service and contributions to extra-curricular clubs and activities
 - (2) Concrete demonstration of outstanding concern for social welfare and contributions to community service
 - (3) Concrete demonstration of outstanding performance in national or international competitions
 - (4) Concrete demonstration of outstanding performance in academic research, literature, fine arts, or athletics
 - (5) Achievements in overcoming difficulties and hardships in the pursuit of an education that can serve as a model for other students
 - (6) Any other achievements that can serve as a model for other students
- IV. Selection category and procedure:
 - (1) College Outstanding Youth:
 1. The dean of each college will form a College Outstanding Youth Selection Committee of 3 to 5 people, who will decide the final list through the examination of the written material and interview. The written material and interview will constitute 50 percents respectively of the entire evaluation.

2. When the entire number of each college exceeds 500, then with every increase of 500 students, there will be one vacancy for this award. (If the increased number is between 250 and 500, there will also be one vacancy.)
3. Each college which has less than 500 students will produce one person for the Outstanding Youth Selection.

(2) University Outstanding Youth:

1. The president will form a University Outstanding Youth Selection Committee of 6 to 14 professors, who will decide the final list through the examination of the written material and interview. The written material and interview will constitute 50 percents respectively of the entire evaluation.
2. The utmost limit of the number for the selection is 1/1000. (Based on the statistics from the Office of Academic Affairs)
3. Students who are elected as College Outstanding Youth are permitted to take part in the University Outstanding Youth Selection.

V. Selection Period: Announce the procedure each year in the late November. The selection of college outstanding youth must be completed before the end of December, while the selection of university outstanding youth must be completed before March 10.

VI. The university outstanding youth award includes the following:

- (1) College Outstanding Youth will be awarded a certificate and plaque, and each college may have extra reward.
School Outstanding Youth will be awarded a certificate and trophy, and other extra award.
- (2) All of the above award will have public recognition during the university's annual Founding Anniversary Celebration.
- (3) A special column will be designed for university publications and the Office of Student Affairs website to introduce the accomplishments of each year's outstanding youth.
- (4) Certain membership in the university's Outstanding Youth Association

VII. Required materials for the selection:

- (1) The candidate's autobiography (format decided by candidate, contents to include a passport-size photo, student's educational and work experience, a description of outstanding service, performance, or contributions with supporting documentation, in both hardcopy and computer file form)
- (2) A complete transcript of the student's academic and behavior grades
- (3) A selection form, which can be downloaded from the Office of Student Affairs website.

VIII. The above procedure will go into effect upon approval by the Student Affairs Council. The same is true of any revisions to the regulations.
